HÉROUX-DEVTEK'S GAS TURBINE COMPONENTS DIVISION AWARDED \$CA 21.6 MILLION IN CONTRACTS

Contracts call exclusively for the manufacture of new components

Longueuil, Quebec, September 22, 2003 -- Héroux-Devtek Inc. (TSX: HRX), a leading Canadian manufacturer of aerospace and industrial products, today announced that it has been selected by GE Aircraft Engines to manufacture new components for CF34, CFM56, CF6, T700, LM2500, and CFE738 engines. The total value of the contracts is estimated at \$CA 21.6 million.

Deliveries of these contracts are scheduled as follows: \$CA 2.5 million in fiscal 2004, \$CA 7.3 million in fiscal 2005, \$CA 6.8 million in fiscal 2006 and \$CA 5.0 million in fiscal 2007.

Héroux-Devtek Inc., a Canadian company, specializes in the design, development, manufacture and repair of aerospace and industrial products. The Company's head office is located in Longueuil, Quebec. Héroux-Devtek operates eight business units grouped under four divisions: the Landing Gear Division, Aerostructure Division, Gas Turbine Components Division and the Logistics and Defence Division. 75% of the Company's sales are outside Canada, mainly in the United States. Héroux-Devtek's shares trade on the Toronto Stock Exchange under the symbol HRX.
